Judge: Dr. Robin Downing Winner: Fran Pennock Shaw Winning Entry: Stem-Cell Therapy May Help Cats Resistant to Traditional Treatment for FCGS *Judge's Comments:* Choosing the winning entry for the Dr. Jim Richards Cornell Feline Health Center Veterinary Issues Award was particularly challenging due to the exceptional nature of the submitted pieces. The Award is given for the highest-quality entry about technological advances, research, new medical developments, or innovations in feline veterinary medicine. The entries this year were diverse and robust, reflecting exciting activities in feline medicine. The award winning article this year is: "Stem-Cell Therapy May Help Cats resistant to Traditional Treatment for FCGS." his article provides a window into an innovative approach to one of the most frustrating of feline medical problems, feline chronic gingivostomatitis (FCGS) - stomatitis for short. As a veterinarian who has been charged with treating these cats, I can attest to the refractory nature of the disorder. The article discusses the ground-breaking work at the University of California College of Veterinary Medicine using fat cell-derived stem cells to treat cats with FCGS who have not responded to conventional therapy, which consists of full mouth dental extractions and immunosuppressive therapy. Learning about this game-changing approach to FCGS will rovide hope to cat owners who long to see their cats' suffering come to an end.

# Special Award #06 Fear Free Pets Award

*Judge's Comments:* There's a lot to love here. It tackles an often-contentious but very important part of regular cat care—nail trims. The videos are easy to follow and clearly show the training techniques. The text is relatable. The author admits to be being clumsy with a clicker and to making timing mistakes, just like the rest of us! So instead of a superstar trainer with a brilliant and perfect cat, we see a human trainer and a feline pupil who are just like us and our cats. This makes the training task seem so much more attainable.

## **Special Award #07 Fear Free Cat Enrichment Award**

#### Winning Entry: Train Your Cat to Walk on a Leash: Outdoor Safety for Indoor Cats

*Judge's Comments:* This entry, by Maggie Martin, aimed directly at cat owners (interesting for a dog site!), focused on a particular activity, and was written at an appropriate literacy level in an engaging "voice". Ms. Martin provided clear, detailed instructions, pointed out potential problems and limitations, and provided a clear summary conclusion. The author also asked for comments, and responded to the ones she received. The site also has a clean, uncluttered look, used an easily readable font, was of reasonable length (for me) and used pictures sparingly and to augment the text.

# Special Award #08 GoodNewsforPets.com Human-Animal Bond Award

#### Winning Entry: Do cats need human interaction or are they completely fine on their own?

*Judge's Comments:* I think one of the most common misunderstandings about cats is that they are independent to the point of indifference. When in reality, cats are often just as bonded to their humans as dogs (though they show it in a very different way!) I chose the entry as the winner because it represents one of the most important facets of the human animal bond, whether it be between pets and their owners or pets and their veterinarians, and that is that while we cannot always expect animals to show us affection in ways that make sense to our human brains, we can learn to interpret their love for us and appreciate the subtle power of the human-animal bond. This post, in which the author tries to clarify the various misinterpretations around a cat's understated feelings

towards their humans, is a perfect example of how I wish all pet owners would view their pets: as creatures with their own feelings and preferences that need to be respected and understood. Rather than expecting her cats to act like dogs or humans, she values and loves them for who they are. As a veterinarian, I need to rely on minute cues to help me understand what is wrong. Animals can't speak to us, so we have to learn to interpret their language. Whether it's in a veterinary setting or at home, learning to understand how our pets communicate with us (even if it's not always in the way we'd like) is crucial to the success of the pet-human bond.
